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
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INTRODUCTION

The 21th Annual International Students' Theory of Knowledge Youth and Culture Conference entitled "Thought-Quake" will be held at EEI, in Istanbul, Turkey, from December 12-15, 2025.

The main objectives of the conference are:

- to have students investigate in detail some of theassumptions and beliefs of their own cultures and those of others.
- to allow students to work more interactively within the perspective of ToK in a real-world context,
- to provide students with greater inter-cultural awareness by bringing young people from different regions and backgrounds together to explore cultural differences, similarities and express their opinions.

The TOK Exhibition that will take place at the conference gives students the opportunity to experience first hand what it feels like to engage in a collaborative learning atmosphere.

The student doing a TOK exhibition is required to prepare one and then present it to the audience in the classrooms. We have reserved a 10 minute slot for each presentation and there will be three successive presentations in 30 minutes.

A session where participants will have a chance to get to know each other.

Thought-quake Activities:

A session where participants will have the opportunity to share and exchange ideas from a TOK perspective.

Turkish Cultural Workshop:

A session which includes pottery, marbling, folk dancing and percussion.

Teacher Discussion Group:

A session for teachers to exchange ideas and experiences.

Cultural Night:

Cultural Night Participants will share their heritage, traditions and customs with each other.


